



CAMS 2010 Spring Classic Information

Date: 29 May 2010

Location: Kinsman Center, 141 School St., Fredericton, NB

Registration: 9:00 am to 12:00 pm (*Note: The Main Display Floor will be closed from 12:30 to 1:30 for Judging.*)

Fees:

- Initial entry fee, for judging, is \$12.00 for first 3 kits, and \$2 for each addition kit to be judged.
- A modeler may enter a maximum four (4) kits in a single category for judging, any additional kits in the category will go on display (for no charge) based on space availability.
- A modeler can enter as many categories as they wish.
- Fee for 'Display Only' is \$5.00. (**Note:** *The number of kits for display will be based on space availability*).
- There is no entry fee for the Junior or Intermediate classes.
- The models must be constructed by the Entrant (if represented, the builder's name must be registered) from one or more marketed kits (plastic or resin) or from scratch.
- Gold, Silver or Bronze medals will be awarded to the modeler's highest scoring kit in each category entered. One medal per modeler, per category.
- Vendor's fee is \$20.00 per table. (**Note:** *Vendors tables must be booked prior to show to guarantee space*).

Prizes:

Every modeler who is registered for Judging or Display is eligible for the Door Prizes. Again this year our sponsors have furnished some great prizes for the Raffle and Silent Auction.

Judging Categories:

Note: The decision of the Coordinator as to Category is final.

A - Military Heavy – Heavy armored vehicles of any scale tracked or wheeled. The category includes the vehicle configured for its original intended purpose (e.g. Churchill MTB) as well as any and all modifications the vehicle went through during its life. (e.g. Flame thrower, ARV, Bridge Layer)

B - Military Light – Light armored vehicles of any scale tracked or wheeled. The category includes the vehicle configured for its original intended purpose (e.g. M-113) as well as, any and all modifications the vehicle went through during its life. (e.g. TOW Carrier, ADATS)

C - Military Soft Skinned - Military Vehicles or Equipment of any scale, whose primary role is Service & Support. This would include trucks, jeeps, heavy transport and motorcycles.

D - Military Misc – Military Vehicles or Equipment of any scale that does not fall into any of the above classes such as airfield support equipment (aircraft tugs, generators), stand alone Artillery Pieces, Anti-aircraft Weapons, Weapons Systems (TOW Launcher), etc

Aircraft - Any non-science fiction flying craft, of any type, including fixed and rotary winged, powered or non-powered, contemporary space ships and rockets, airships, blimps and balloons falling into the following scales.

F: Aircraft – Small: - Kits 1/72 scale or smaller

G: Aircraft – Medium: - Kits between 1/71 and 1/48 scale

H: Aircraft – Large: - Kits larger than 1/48 scale

I: Ships: - Any ships or submarines all scales.

J: Automotive Street: - Cars or light trucks in any scale. This class includes all types of vehicles except those used or designed exclusively for racing

K: Automotive Racing: - Cars or trucks in any scale that are used or built exclusively for racing of any type

L: Automotive Truck: - Heavy trucks with or without trailers in any scale, of all types excluding racing.

M: Automotive Misc.: - Vehicles and equipment that do not fit into the above. Including construction equipment, motorcycles, free standing trailers.

Figures: A bust or a maximum of 2 characters, any type, posed but not interacting. Fantasy, Sci/Fi figures accepted.

N: Figures Small: - 54mm (1/32, 1/35) or smaller

O: Figures Large: - larger than 54mm (1/32, 1/35)

P: Fantasy / Sci-fi: - Any fantasy/science fiction aircraft, vehicles, equipment or figures (figures may be entered in either Figures **or** Sci/Fi but **not** both)

Q: Dioramas: - A Diorama is a collection of items (figures, vehicles, whatever) that are staged within a scene. A diorama tells a story. A diorama may contain whatever is required to tell that story.

R: Vignettes: - A vignette is a “moment in time” or a snapshot of a scene as opposed telling a story. Vehicles may be utilized provided they are not part of the focus of the Vignette.

S: Junior: - This class is for ages 0 – 12, kits of any type or scale. Juniors may move up to Intermediate.

Note: Models judged in the Junior Category are not eligible for Best in Show.

T: Intermediate: - This class is for ages 13 - 17, kits of any type or scale. Intermediates may move up to the Adult’s categories. **Note: Models judged in the Intermediate Category are not eligible for Best in Show.**

U: Open Misc: - This is open to models that do not generally fall into any of the above classes such as log splitters, stump grinders.

Theme/Special Categories: Modelers must note on the registration and model information forms that they are to be included in the Theme/Special Categories. If is not noted, they Will Not be considered.

Canadiana: - This is open to models that were built to represent military equipment utilized by the Canadian Military and civilian equipment **specifically** built for the Canadian market (e.g. Beaumonts, Pontiac Acadian, Mercury Trucks etc) **No ‘What If’ Schemes Allowed.**

Invasion: - 70th Anniversary of the German Invasion of the West - Vehicles, Aircraft, Ships, Personnel or Equipment, that took part in any battle that took place between the Axis and the Allies from Jan 1, 1940 to Dec 31, 1940. Anything from the end of the Norway campaign, to the invasion of France, Battle of Britain, etc. can be included. The Modeler must be prepared to verify models inclusion.

Das Autos: - Any German Automobile. Audi, Porsche, BMW, Mercedes, VW, etc., Vintage, Classic or new qualify. Car makes that have been taken over by the Germans and remade are eligible e.g. Modern Minis.

21st Century Pony Cars - Any Mustang, Camero, or Challenger, from the year 2000 to present. As long as it starts out as a 2000 or newer body from one of these, it is good to go.
